Dear Parents, Alumni, and Friends of HPA,

I'm very pleased to send along this follow-up to my letter to you of July 29 and, in doing so, to pass along the good news that the fully renovated Stanford W. Shutes Track will be open for use by Academy employees at 10 a.m. on Monday, September 13, and open for community use at 5 a.m. on the next day, September 14. This is 11 days earlier than we had originally thought would be the case and we're looking forward to hosting our first home cross country meet and football game on the totally renovated field (and with the new seating area to be used for the first time, too) on Saturday, October 2. We are very grateful for those who have respected rules applicable to our process of construction and the "cure period" for the track. Respect for these regulations has certainly played a big part in bringing the facility to its completion point ahead of schedule.

In preparing for the opening of our new track, we reached out to some representatives from a number of groups supportive of HPA. Among these were our track donors, parents of our students, graduates, and faculty members. As a result of (a) input from these individuals, (b) internal deliberations between our senior administrative team, (c) our understanding of policies currently in place at other schools, and (d) consideration of risk management issues, new parameters have been established for community use of the track, "community use" meaning access by individuals who are not enrolled at or employed by HPA. These policies have been developed so we can continue to welcome visitors to the facility, but with sound security practices in mind and with use times in place that are compatible with HPA's daily Upper Campus schedule. You will see these rules posted at various locations around the track, which will be open to recreational walkers, runners, and joggers as follows:

Monday – Friday:	5 a.m. to 7:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. to sunset
Saturday:	5 to 7:30 a.m.
Sunday:	5 to 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. to sunset

We have also examined the question of other Upper Campus areas where, with reasonable security practices in mind, we can continue to welcome our visiting walkers and runners. As a result, we have created a "Green Zone" where visitors who wish to jog, walk, or stroll can do so. Community use hours for the Green Zone will be the same as for the track. While we cannot allow dogs on the track, we will continue to welcome our canine friends in the Green Zone provided that certain precautions are taken. These and other items relating to visiting walkers and runners are set forth in brochures to be available by Thursday, September 9 on various "sandwich boards" placed at several Upper Campus locations. [Accompanying this letter is an electronic copy of the tri-fold brochure.] Please note that (1) for reasons dealing with student and faculty safety and security, the Green Zone is more limited than areas to which some community visitors might be accustomed to running or walking, and (2) use regulations for the pool, gymnasium, and tennis center are unaffected and remain as before.

Many thanks in advance to our visiting walkers and runners for your understanding of, and adherence to, our new access and use rules. And thanks also to everyone who has worked so hard and long to bring to fruition the completed track, the newly renovated football/soccer field, and the policies involving each.

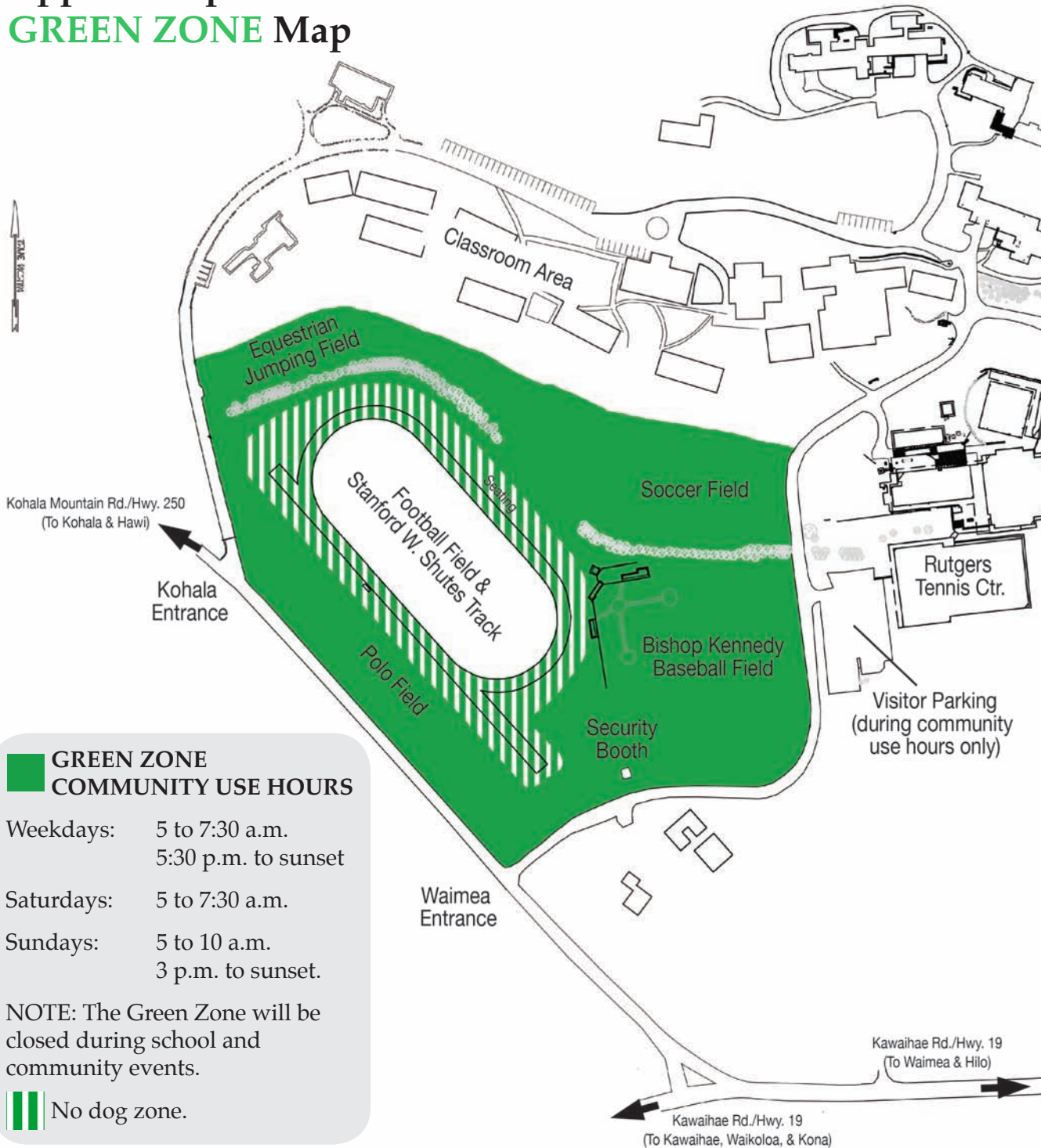
We look forward to seeing you on our Upper Campus. Enjoy!

Dear Runners and Walkers,

Recently, it has become necessary to develop new policies with respect to those who are visiting our campus for the purpose of enjoying a walk or a run. The purpose of this message is to present these new policies to you prior to their effective date and, in that way, to effect a smooth transition from old policies to new ones.

As a school, our prime directive is two-fold: (a) to provide a quality education for our students and (b) to present our educational program in an environment that is safe, secure, and sanitary. Because HPA has a significant boarding student population and around-the-clock responsibility relating to such students, our concern with safety and security is, by our very nature, accentuated. With these thoughts in mind and in an effort to be able to continue to open a portion of our campus to our friends who are recreational walkers and runners, the following access and use policies have been formulated, and will become applicable to our visiting walkers and runners on Tuesday, September 14, 2010:

PARKING

Visitors may park in marked stalls in the Rutgers Tennis Center parking lot during community use hours.

GREEN ZONE

Visiting runners and walkers are asked to enjoy their exercise within the Green Zone depicted on the map on the back of this brochure. As you will see, the Green Zone does not extend to the area behind our classroom buildings or to the proximity of our dormi-

tories. We must limit access—no matter how well-intended or innocent—to these areas. This is not our preference but, in the world today, this is a precaution that must now be taken for the good of all.

USE HOURS

Runners and walkers are invited to enjoy use of the Green Zone on weekdays from 5 to 7:30 a.m. and from 5:30 p.m. to sunset. On Saturdays, the Green Zone will be open for visitor walking and running from 5 to 7:30 a.m., and on Sundays from 5 to 10 a.m. and from 3 p.m. to sunset. Please note that, on days when we host school or community events, the Green Zone will be closed.

THE STANFORD W. SHUTES TRACK

The completely renovated Stanford W. Shutes Track will open to the community on Tuesday, September 14. For visiting walkers and runners, we are very pleased to make the track available on the same days and during the same time periods as the Green Zone. Because the track is such a complex and expensive facility, a number of use regulations will apply specifically to the track. These rules will be posted at several locations around the track. We ask that all visitors using the track respect these rules and, in addition, that our visitors alert Security personnel if others are observed acting in ways not permitted. Let's all enjoy and protect the new Stan Shutes Track!

FOOTBALL/SOCCER FIELD

Visitors seeking to access the football/soccer field are asked to secure advance permission from Stephen Perry, Athletic Director (881-4027).

DOGS

Dogs and other animals are not permitted on the track and field, in the seating area, or in the grassy perimeter areas adjacent to the track (indicated by green striped area on the map). For now, dogs are permitted in the Green Zone with our visiting walkers during Green Zone visiting hours, provided they are leashed at all times and fully under control and provided further that any excrement from an animal is bagged and removed without a trace left behind. We will continue to monitor this situation, and we respectfully reserve the right to alter our approach to dogs if circumstances suggest that modification—or even elimination—of this limited dog access policy is in the best interests of the school.

We are hopeful that you will continue to enjoy your visits to HPA's Upper School campus. Please accept our sincere appreciation for your receipt of this letter, your understanding of its contents, and, beginning on Tuesday, September 14, your adherence to these new policies.
